Going back to our roots



If we know where we came from, we may better know where to go. If we know who we came from, we may better understand who we are In preparation for the Jubilee Year 2025, the Church invites us to go back to our roots and deepen our understanding of who we are.

In this context, we are asked to familiarize ourselves with four key documents of the Second Vatican Council.

Although this Council took place 60 years ago, its documents have not been disseminated widely and hence many Catholics have not had the opportunity to appreciate its rich insights.

Lumen Gentium, the first of these four documents, was explained to us by Fr. Fabian, and he now gives to us here, in this Keystone (overleaf), a summary of its main points.

May these efforts encourage and assist us in our journey as Pilgrims of Hope.

As we prepare for the Jubilee year in 2025, Pope Francis has urged us to reflect on the core documents of the Second Vatican Council.

Among these foundational texts stands Lumen Gentium, meaning "Light of the Nations". Comprising eight chapters, Lumen Gentium answers the questions on the origin of the Church, its life and destiny. Understanding the essence of the Church and its role, profoundly shapes its self-perception and its interaction with the world.

The following are the 8 chapters of the document

Chapter I: Explores the **Church's foundation** in Christ's preaching of the kingdom of God.

Chapter II: Defines the Church as the **People of God**, united in Christ.

Chapter III: Discusses the **hierarchical structure of the Church**, including the role of bishops and the unity of the Church under the leadership of the Pope.

Chapter IV: Acknowledges the vital role of the laity in the Church's mission.

Chapter V: Affirms the call for all members of the Church to strive for holiness.


Chapter VI: Explores the unique vocation of **religious life** within the Church.

Chapter VII: Contemplates the **Church's ultimate destiny and purpose**, illuminated by the lives of the saints and the faithful departed, in our journey as pilgrims to the heavenly Jerusalem.

Chapter VIII: Honours the role of **Mary in the Church's mystery** and salvation history, her unique relationship with Christ and her maternal intercession for the Church.

As we embark on this journey of reflection and rediscovery, let us draw inspiration from the wonderful teachings of Lumen Gentium to deepen our understanding of our faith and our communal journey as the People of God.

Together, let us embrace the call to live out our vocation with renewed fervour and dedication, guided by Christ, the light that illuminates our path.

Fostering a sense of warmth and togetherness, various communities got together, engaged...and forged new connections







This course is called "I.M.F.E." which stands for the Institute for Ministry of Faith Enrichment.

To be eligible, one has to have experience in a particular ministry for two years as well as at least six months in a leadership post.

"It helped equip me to understand Church teachings in the Inter Religious sphere and develop a Vision for the Multi Faith group and plan long term goals." - Brian D'Souza










- 4. Add soaked stems, tamarind, more water and simmer for 10 minutes.
- 5. Rasam is ready; remove stems if preferred drink as soup too.

Who/What is the YSS?



The St. Peter's Youth Social Service popularly called the YSS was founded by Fr. Douglas Rowe s.j. in 1970, together with five founder members - Clarence Gomes, Fr. Richard D'Souza s.j., Benjamin Saldanha, Claude Baretto and Jimmy Machado. This five man army was the off-shoot of the St. Peter's Summer Holiday Club.



Each of this five man army invested Re 1/- from their pocket money. With the princely sum of Rs.5/-, they opened an account in Dena Bank, Boran Road and established the YSS, which today has a budget large enough to enable them to undertake various community need-based activities.

The YSS runs the parish library and the employment bureau, conducts blood donation camps and a summer holiday club for children not able to go out on a vacation, distributes text books free to needy students...

Other community based activities undertaken, are the medical camps conducted to promote awareness, interactive meetings with the police and municipal authorities and recreational projects to enhance employment opportunities for the youth.

"We serve others to show we care' is the motto of the St. Peter's Youth Social Service.

May their tribe increase!
